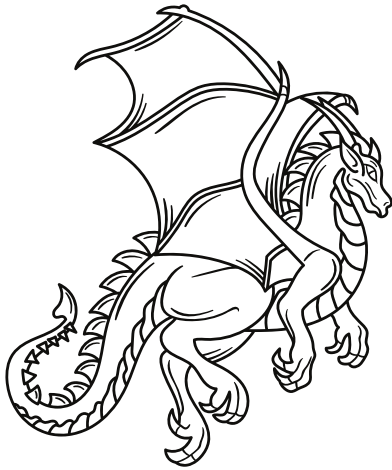


WRITE A CINQUAIN

A cinquain, pronounced "sin-cane", is a form of simple poetry with 5 lines. It was invented by Adelaide Crapsey, an American poet who took her inspiration from Japanese haiku and tanka.

Write your own cinquain about a mythical creature using the space and format below.

LINE ONE : A NOUN WHICH IS THE SUBJECT OF THE POEM

LINE TWO: TWO ADJECTIVES THAT DESCRIBE THE SUBJECT

LINE THREE: THREE VERBS THAT DESCRIBE THE SUBJECT

LINE FOUR: A SHORT PHRASE THAT DESCRIBES THE SUBJECT

LINE FIVE: A SYNONYM OF THE SUBJECT, OR A WORD THAT SUMS IT UP
